Key Figures

+ The cost of running St George's in 2023 was **£121, 802.** The two largest costs are *Common Fund* (paid to CofE

Birmingham to provide clergy for this parish and less affluent places) and Utilities (especially gas).

+ Regular giving in 2023 was **£54**, **755**. Including Gift Aid, regular giving met **55%** of our regular costs. The rest was funded through occasional gifts, church hire, fees and use of reserves.

Christian Giving

+ The Church of England teaches that Christians should give 10% of our disposable income: 5% to church & 5% to charity.

+ The national average gift to churches is £16.20 per giver per week (2022). Many give significantly more, but if St George's received this from most of our regular worshippers, we'd run a surplus to invest in our mission & secure our future.
